Dear Parents, Parish members and Friends of St. Nicholas,

In just one short year, we renovated our gym, opened the Kevin Kannengeiser's Activity Center, installed a new gym roof, renovated three junior high classrooms, installed lockers and we now lunch together as a community under the big blue canopies in our quad area. Our teachers have traveled across the country to learn about the latest in curriculum instruction in language arts. We have integrated enrichment electives for our junior high students to have new experiences such as yoga, financial literacy, coding and photojournalism. We have invested nearly \$10,000 into our classroom libraries so that our students can select from the latest contemporary literature works and have a wide assortment of non-fiction selections to explore. All these measures help us build a future here at St. Nicholas School with unlimited possibilities.

Our school theme this year is "Practice Hospitality In our Classroom, School and Our Community", taken from Romans 12:13, When God's people are in need, be ready to help them and always be eager to practice hospitality. We integrate this theme in all that we do each day, teaching our younger generation, who sometimes forget to look up and practice how to welcome each other.

I invite you to explore the newly formatted publication, *The Celtic*, and read about the school news happening around our campus. Read what our high schools are saying about how our graduates of St. Nicholas are prepared and see what impact these graduates have made in their high school environments. Examine our academic achievement scores and see how we compare to our local Los Altos public schools.

These achievements, and those to unfold in the near future, were made possible through the active gift of support to our Annual Appeal. We welcome our amazing new teachers this school year. They are such a blessing to our students.









#### St. Nicholas School Public School Comparison 2018

The following charts reflect the academic performance of St. Nicholas School on the 2017 CAASP\* against the following public schools near St. Nicholas School.












## Reading and Writing \*\*Program\*\*

Over the past two years, St. Nicholas School has launched a robust language arts instruction program that is designed to maximize student growth and confidence in reading and writing. Our programs go above and beyond the CA Common Core Standards and create a dynamic learning environment in which students grow by leaps and bounds.

Transforming the way we instruct students in language arts began with the implementation of the Lucy Calkins Units of Study for Reading and Writing in grades K-8. Training of our teachers began at Teachers College, Columbia University where the curriculum was first imagined. This year, each week, teachers meet to discuss student learning, examine growth and share best practices for instruction. Our students haven chosen to participate in our 40 book challenge this year, and their veracity for reading is translating into rich discussions about author's purpose, point of view and character development.

"They are experiencing their writing not simply as a stream of consciousness to fill the pages but as something that is more akin to the kind of intellectual property that must be crafted and developed and consciously re-worked in order to make it better," as stated by one of our parents. St. Nicholas School's success in raising the quality of teaching, resulting in high level student output has been recognized by the diocese, with over 40 educators visiting our campus to observe and learn about our comprehensive model.











Students are encouraged to develop higher level critical skills (synthesizing, analyzing and critiquing) while fostering effective reading strategies promoting purposeful, lifelong literacy.

The Writers' Workshop format focuses on a deep understanding of the critical areas of argumentative, informational and narrative writing, preparing our students for the rigors of their high school environments. The classes are structured with ample time available to provide clear goal-setting and most importantly, collaborative and constructive feedback. Students are guided in not only clean, single content writing but also taught to develop and refine strategies for writing across a curriculum integrating math, science, literature and religion. Our program is designed to help students meet and exceed rigorous global standards while creating strong writers who will have a voice in the world.

## Congratulations Mary Bujalski



Congratulations to Mary Bujalski on her retirement! Mrs. Bujalski worked for the Diocese of San Jose for the past 24 years, spending her last 10 years at St. Nicholas School. Our science curriculum and program under the tutelage of Mrs. Bujalski, was transformed to offer our students the highest quality of educational experiences in the field of science. As many of you know and have experienced, she used a project-based learning approach to launch the Challenge Project in 8th grade, where students work to envision a company and create and market a new flavor of ice cream, gelato, sorbet or other frozen dessert. The teams develop a recipe that will attract customers, research chemical processes used in making frozen emulsion colloids, learn about proportions of fats to sugars, create a marketing campaign to sell their product and compose an expository essay detailing the entire experience. The challenge project ends with a schoolwide tasting and an award is given to the favorite flavor. She knew that these types of projects help our students learn science in real world settings.

Our alumni and student survey data suggests that Science continues to be one of our areas of strength with numerous students advancing into honor classes in Science in their high schools. This has been due to the dedication of Mrs. Bujalski over the number of years she was here at St. Nicholas School. Many alumni return to tout valuable lab skills that they learned from Mrs. Bujalski and cite her as the source of inspiration for their direction to study a particular field of science as they approach college. We are so grateful to Mrs. Bujalski's commitment to excellence and we look forward to following in her footsteps with many Challenge Projects in the future.














#### Closing The GAP

Funds contributing to closing the GAP help to pay for our Educational Enrichment Programs, the low student to teacher ratio, and all other expenses required to operate the school. The actual costs of educating each student exceeds our annual tuition fees by nearly eleven (11%) percent. To subsidize the difference, we rely upon our Annual Appeal to keep tuition affordable in the Catholic tradition.

#### The Mary O'Shea Scholarship Fund

This fund supports students who are otherwise unable to attend St. Nicholas School due to financial constraints. A gift here honors our retired, beloved long-time librarian, Mary O'Shea, who made an extraordinary impact on our school community. #### **The Endowment Fund**

This fund is a gift that gives forever. Our Endowment Fund has a current value of almost \$1.7 million with earnings that support our operating budget. As the principal of the endowment fund is never touched, the fund generates consistent and guaranteed interest income for our school. The predictability of this income allows us to plan for the future and sustain the level of excellence for which our school is known.

#### Gift of Stock NO GIFT IS TOO SMALL TO SUPPORT OUR MISSION.




# Capital Improvements

We have demonstrated a deep-seated desire to improve the educational and environmental experience for current and future Celtics. Great work was completed over the past years, significantly improving our worn facilities and invigorating the spirit of the school. Each donation was an investment in our future. Over the past three years capital projects have strengthened our learning landscape and moved us closer towards addressing our critical campus needs. Our students have the opportunity to be inspired to learn and grow in these renovated spaces.

As a part of a two year plan, the most recent capital improvement at St. Nicholas School focused on bringing all of our original classrooms up to today's standards of teaching. We began last summer by focusing on the junior high classrooms to improve the regulation of room temperature by installing new insulated windows and fans, installing new carpet and freshened up the space with paint and new desks as well as new collaborative tables and whiteboards. New lockers were added outside the junior high classrooms. In addition, to improve safety, new locks were installed on all K-8 classrooms and now all children from grades 1-8 eat their lunch in community under the beautiful blue awnings protected from the sun. Finally, a special thanks to VMware, a global leader in cloud infrastructure and workspace technology, who donated 90 laptops to the junior high classrooms over the Summer. From this wonderful donation, students can now collaborate with other technological advancements in the classroom. These major improvements were made possible by the generosity of the parents and community and we are very blessed and grateful for their contribution to our school's future.
